The chapter is also supported by a Mothers' Club, made up of the mothers of members.

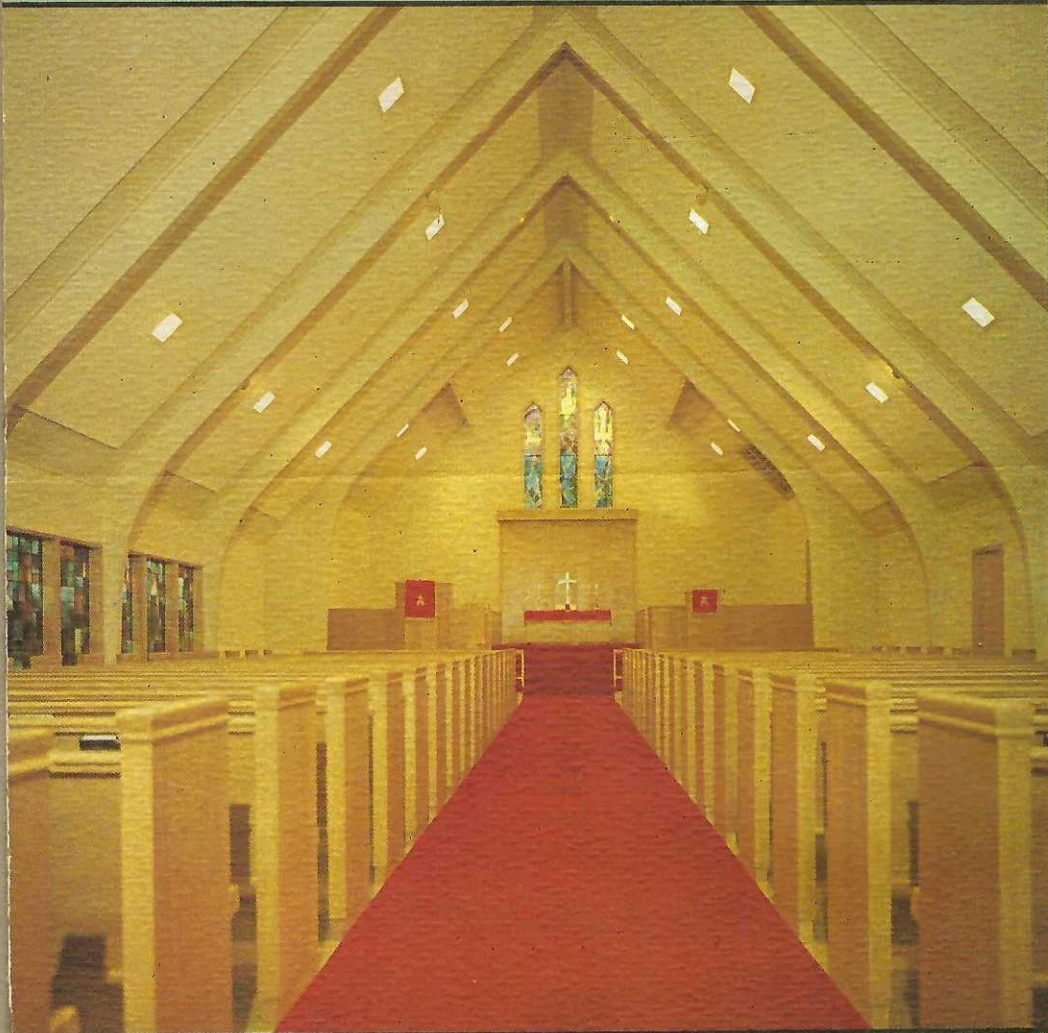

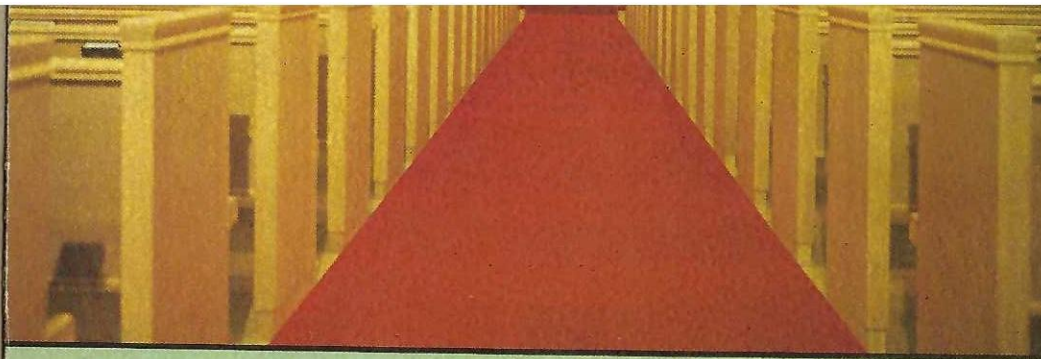
Mrs. Sharp Gets First De Molay Mothers' Pin

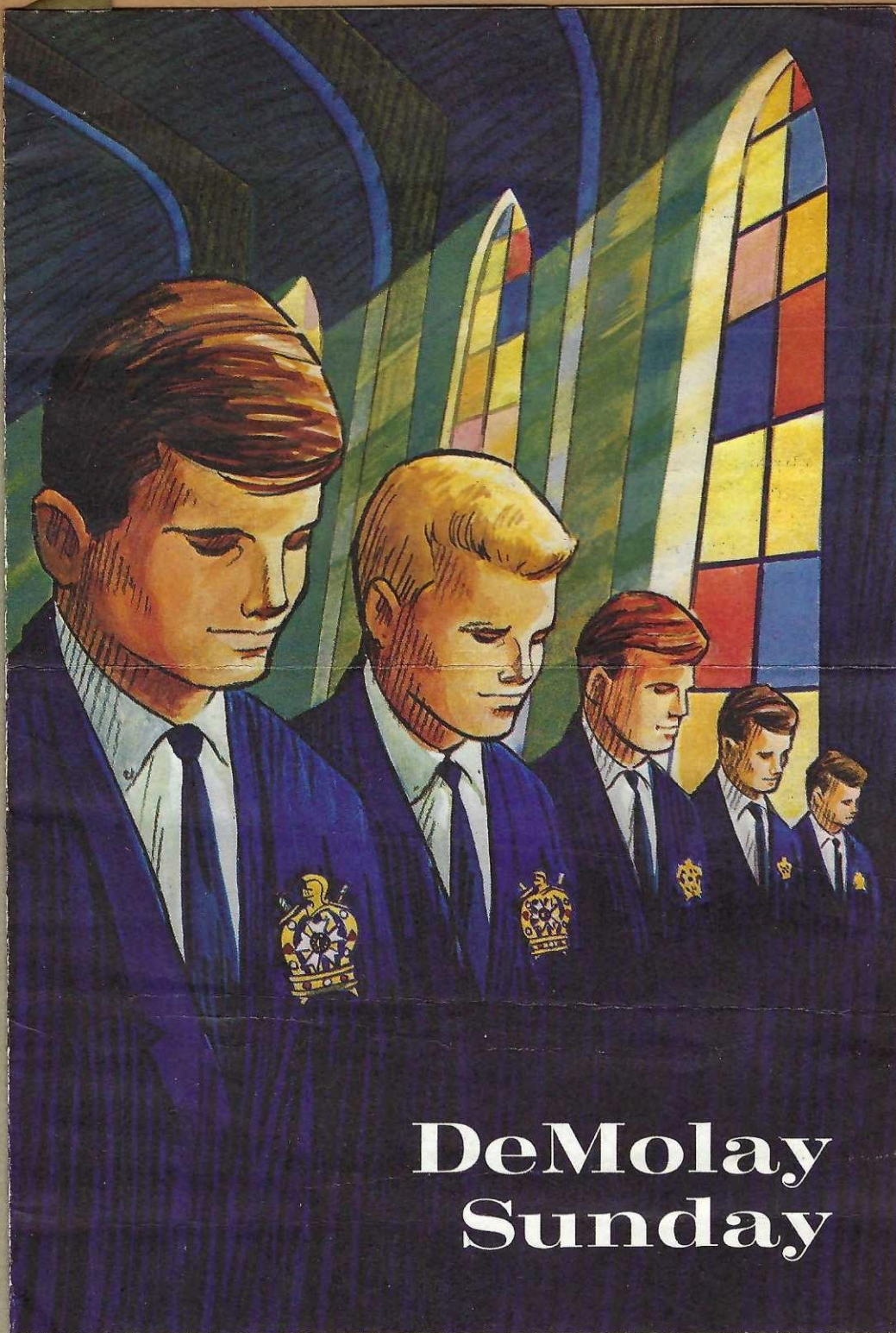
