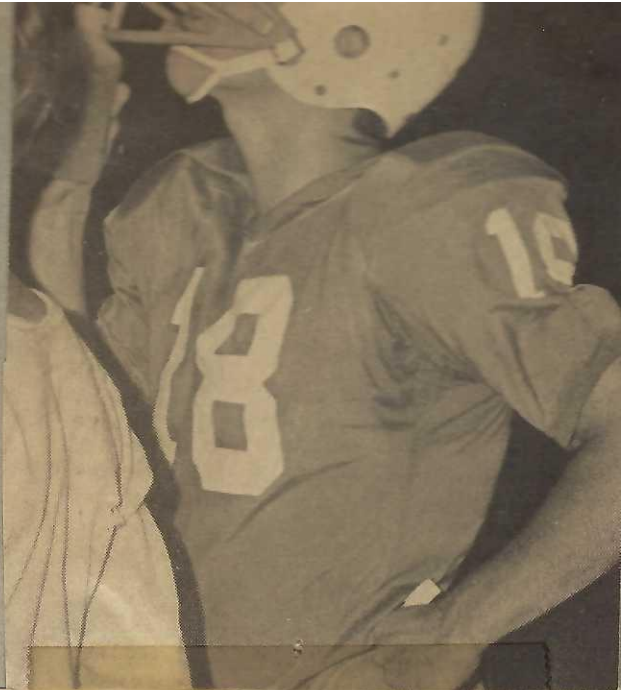

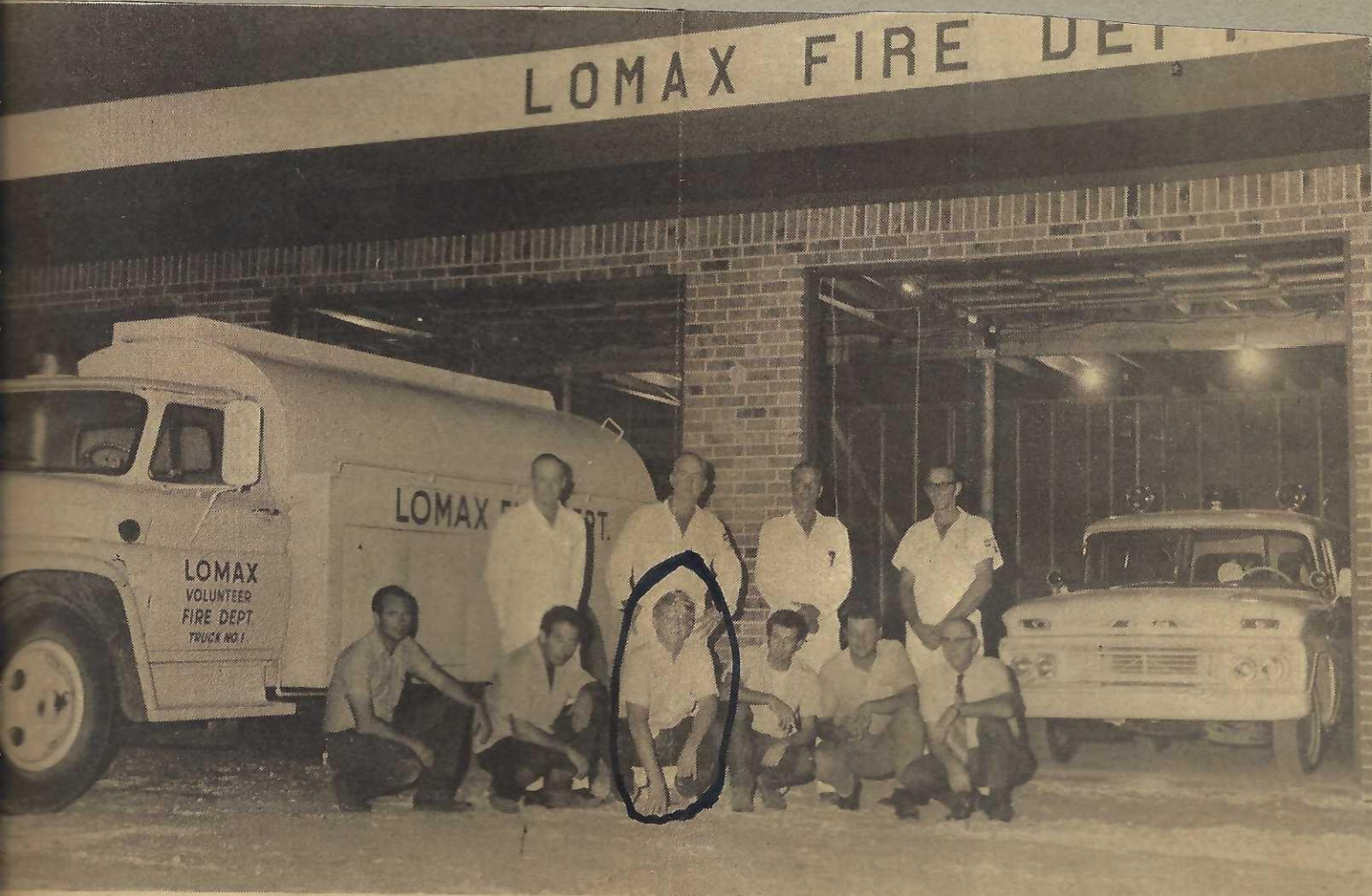

# Art Goforth guest speaker of DeMolays

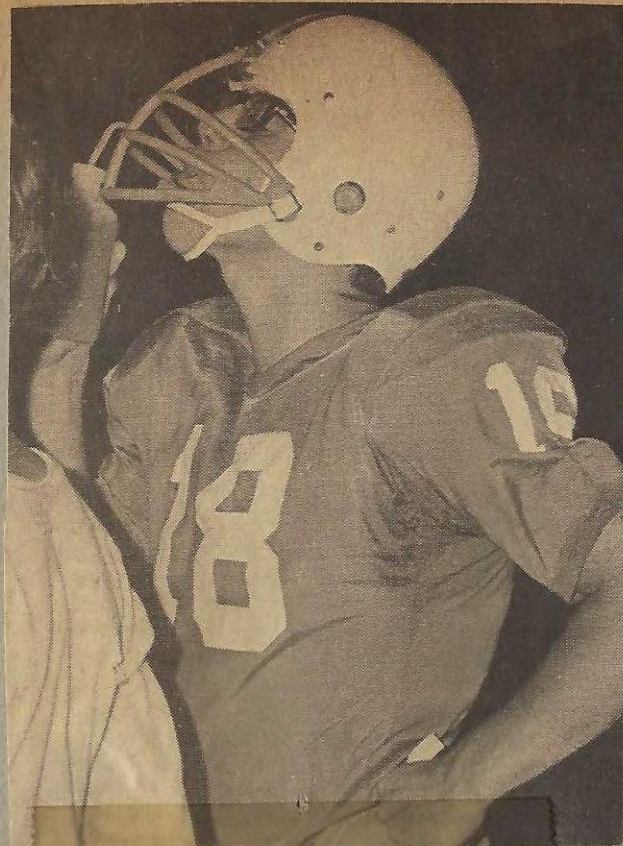

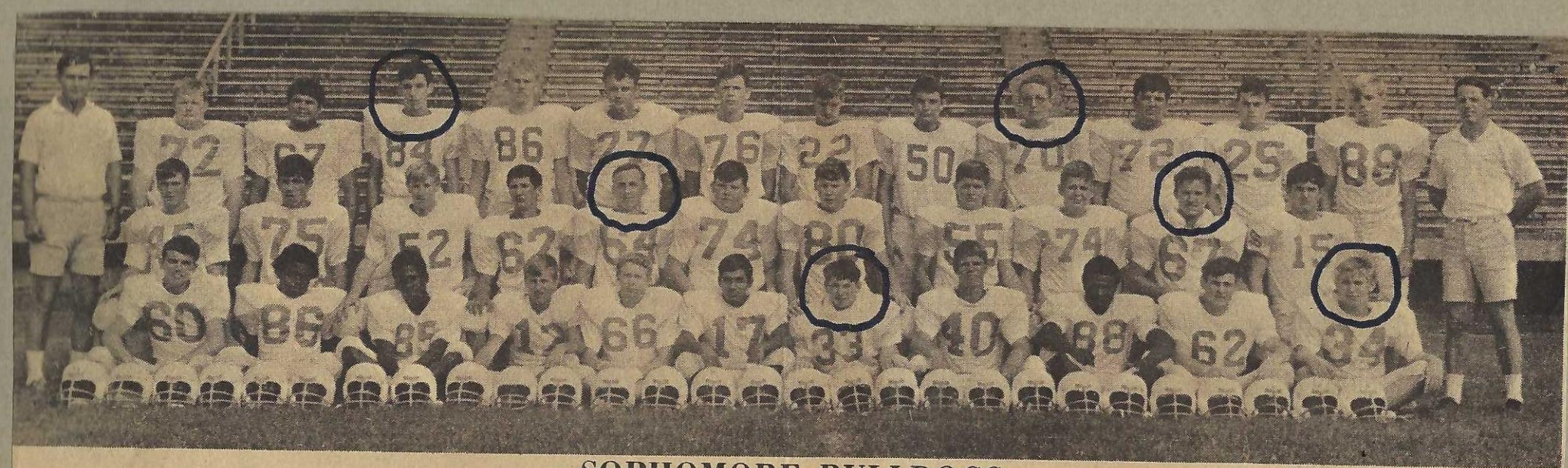

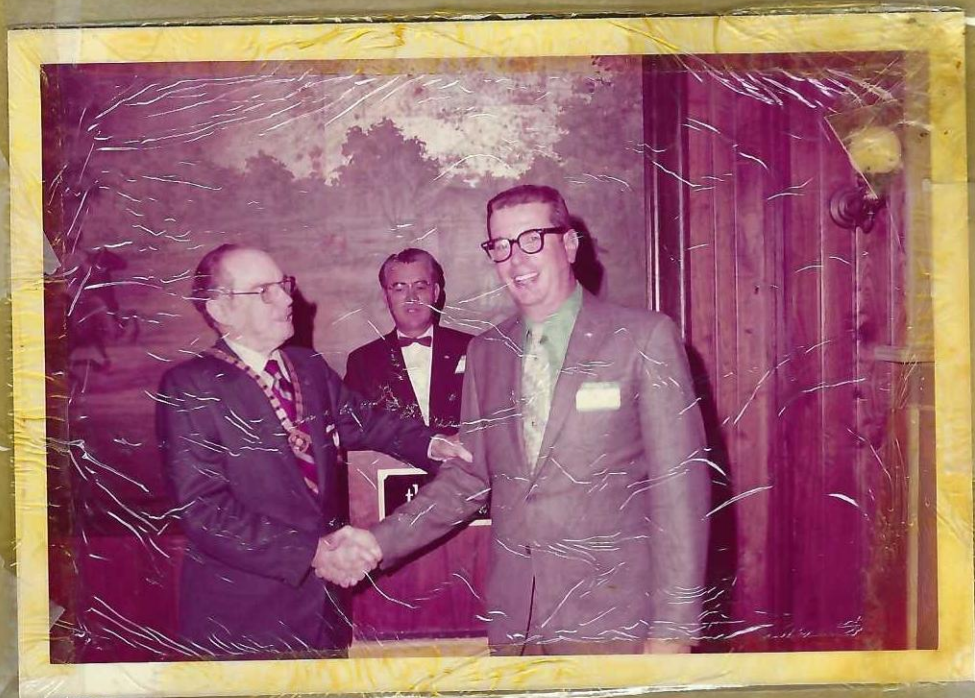
