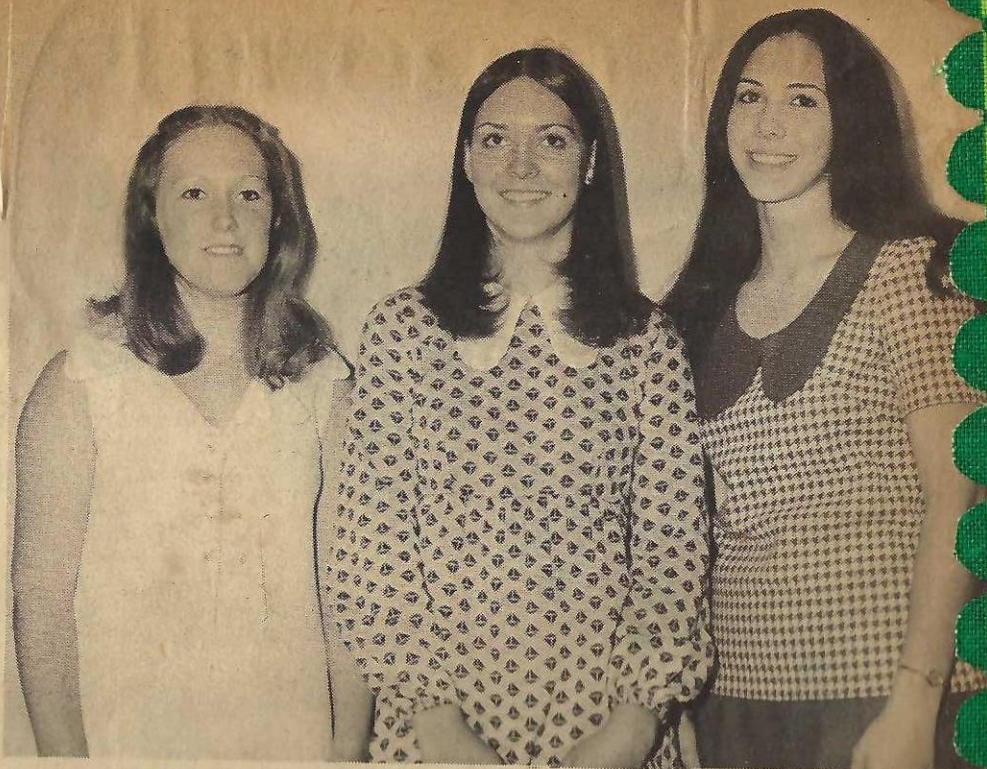

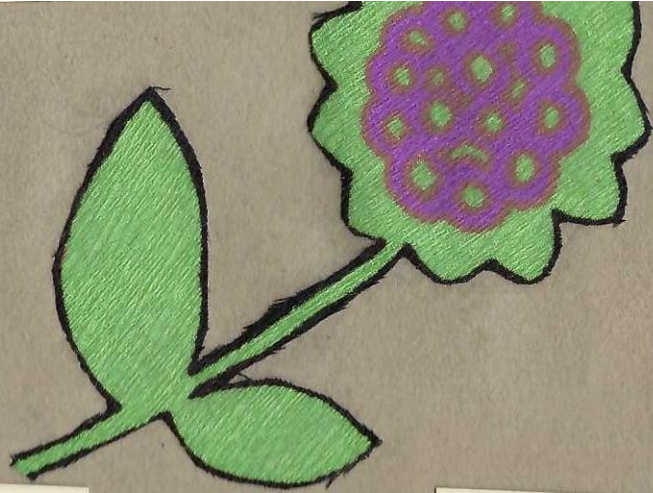

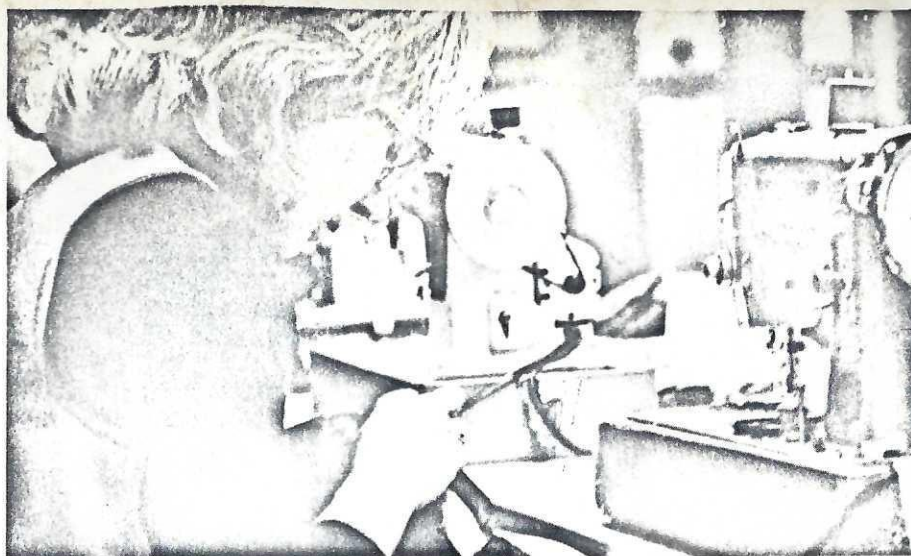
In Texas, the Chapter Mothers' Clubs are banded together in groups designated as areas, and Mrs. Ralph E. Morris of Pasadena, Tex., who is the Director for Area 5, reports on several interesting activities by the eleven clubs in her area.

An area-wide benefit movie was held on January 14 to raise funds for the scholarship fund, and a total of \$543.10 was netted.

Another distinctive activity of this group of Mothers' Clubs was the formation of an area sewing guild. The purpose of the guild is to combine the sewing talents of many mothers from several different clubs for making a set of DeMolay or Initiatory Degree robes for a particular chapter.
